

<u>St Mary Crowned to welcome Bishop Patrick</u> Fr Martin writes,

Here's a date for your diary: 7pm on 7th September, the Eve of Our Lady's Birthday. Bishop Patrick will be coming to celebrate Holy Mass for Our Lady's feast at St Mary Crowned Church, in its (by then) repaired and redecorated glory! I'm delighted that Bishop Patrick accepted our invitation to celebrate with us, and I'm delighted, too, that Father Greg has also accepted our invitation to be one of the concelebrants.

We are still fundraising for the second phase of the work, to add two lavatories and an enclosed area for refreshments, both of them to be situated at the end of the church furthest from the altar.

Cheques towards the improvements can be made payable to *St Mary RC Glossop RCP* and sent to Glossop Catholic Parishes, Royle House, Church Street, Glossop SK13 7RJ. One kind anonymous donor has already given £5,000, as reported in last week's newsletter. The need to perform the work to the standards necessary in a listed building means that this second phase is expected to cost somewhere between £40,000 and £60,000.

Once both phases of the work have been completed, we'll arrange another celebration and invite people from our schools, and from other local churches, as well as neighbours of the church and civic dignitaries. We might even be able to get Bishop Patrick and Father Greg to return for that celebration too!
