PARISH NOTES

THIS SUNDAY is the seventh Sunday in ordinary time. Those somewhat longer of tooth and greyer of hair will remember it being called "Sexagesima Sunday" - the second Sunday before Lent. The liturgical 'countdown' to Easter began last Sunday "Septuagesima Sunday" (70 days); 'Sexagesima' indicates 60 days, though in fact we are 56 days away from Easter Sunday. By time we get to Lent (Quadragesima/40th), a week on Wednesday, the maths are almost right, with Ash Wednesday being 40 days to Good Friday.

The highlight word of the readings is "Compassion" - to suffer alongside some one. The heart of the matter is be as kind to others as you are to yourself.

PASTORAL LETTER this Sunday Bishop Patrick speaks to everyone in the diocese on the planned diocesan response to the Synod, and locally, plans for the future shape of parishes, deaneries and diocese. You can find a copy of the pastoral letter on the parish website.

BISHOP PATRICK GOES GLOBAL An in-depth interview with our Bishop is being broadcast this Sunday on the shalomworld.org website. The programme is called 'Heart Talk' and is broadcast at 7.30 pm.

THIS WEEK on Tuesday we celebrate a chair. Sounds peculiar? However, it is the time when we honour the Petrine Office and 'chair of teaching' of the pope. We are used to hearing that Professor Smith holds the chair of biology at this or that university. Our cathedrals have impressive chairs (cathedra) indicating the Bishop's authority to teach the truths of Christ as manifest in our catechism. The Bishop of Rome occupies the chair of St Peter, the chief apostle. This Tuesday on that feastday, the Bishop will be leading Vespers at the cathedral. During that time of prayer the Synodal Process moves on a step. This event is being live-streamed so that those at a distance can join in.

SCHOOL HOLS We wish the dedicated staff of our schools a restful time during half-term break. Equally, I hope the weather is kinder this week than stormy last week, and that pupils will have chance to get out and about.

THE SYNODAL PROCESS

Our next parish step is to engage with two ongoing questions for the future of our parish and its people:

- 1. As parishioners do we know people who feel marginalised or separated from the parish and wider society?
- 2. How can we best respond?

Please suggest two identifiable ways we can help such people locally, and also a long-term action whereby we as parishes are challenged to reach out and listen to marginalised and

separated people.
