 I know the terms 'Crime and Punishment' and what they mean. I know how the Romans brought aspects of Crime and Punishment to Britain and how they implemented this. I know how the legal system in Saxon England worked and can compare it to Britain today. I know some of the popular punishment methods used in Tudor times, and discuss why they are not used today. I know about the life of Dick Turpin through using historical sources. I know how the Victorians would punish criminals. 	 I know where on a timeline, the Early Islamic civilisation would be placed and which era it is comparable to in British history. I know the role Bagdad played in Early Islamic civilisation. I know about the House of Wisdom and how it became a centre for learning. I know some of the significant developments made by early Islamic scholars and how these had an impact across the world. I know who Muhammed was and why he was significant. I know why the Early Islamic civilisation became a major power in the world because of the Silk Road.
