PARISH NOTES

THIS SUNDAY we celebrate the solemnity of Mary the Mother of God. The feast is a celebration of Mary being the mother of Jesus. The English title "Mother of God" is a literal translation of the Latin title Mater Dei, which in turn is a rendering of the Greek title Θεοτόκος (Theotokos), meaning "Bearer of God" dogmatically adopted by the First Council of Ephesus (431) as an assertion of the divinity of Christ. The Second Vatican Council stated: "Clearly from earliest times the Blessed Virgin is honoured under the title of Mother of God." and at an early stage the Church in Rome celebrated on 1 January a feast that it called the anniversary (Natale) of the Mother of God.

THE SOLEMNITY OF THE EPIPHANY is celebrated on Friday. It is a holyday of obligation, and also of course Twelfth Night. Note that an additional Mass will be celebrated at noon at St Charles that day.

THE FUNERAL arrangements for Kevin Laidlaw are indicated for Immaculate Conception church at 11am on Tues 17th January. May he rest in peace.

A QUESTION OF IDENTITY Maybe it was preliminary thoughts as we journeyed into Advent that led me to wonder why I had no birth certificate. I was fairly confident that I had been born, even though I had no particular memory of that event. So, in mid-December I contacted the General Register Office and asked if they could help to prove my existence — or who I was. On the feast of the Holy Family I received in the post a copy of my Birth Certificate which tells the world that I was born in the Women's hospital in Derby, a lifetime ago. Being reassured that I wasn't delivered by a stork, or discovered under a gooseberry bush, I rejoiced that I had documentary proof of me. No longer a need to pinch myself. It added a tinge of completeness to my personal document file. However, reading through the birth certificate I noted at the end the dire warning that this certificate is not evidence of identity. Then I began to muse what is proof of identity, and where should I lodge this legal document?: under medical records?, in the priestly-ministerial file? In my will?

Joseph and Mary came to Bethlehem to register their existence in a census. We are required by the government to complete the census I think every 10 years. Is that sufficient proof of identity? Did Joseph scurry off to the Bethlehem register office to record the birth of our saviour? If so, who was listed as 'father'?

The whole of the New Testament wrestles with the question of the identity of Mary's son. On this Sunday as we celebrate Mary the mother of God, we celebrate not only Mary's Fiat but also the deepest down identity of Jesus. The scriptures are his 'certification of identity'. And back to the question of my self-identity. Time to pause and wrestle with that one! For the time being I'm lodging my new identity in the file containing my Baptismal and ordination certificates.
