

PARISH NOTES

THIS SUNDAY we celebrate the sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time. (elsewhere it's called Sexagesima Sunday, i.e. second before Lent). In the Gospel we see both the divine power and the divine compassion of Jesus in this act of healing. The divine power was necessary in all instantaneous cures. Even if the diseases were curable, the ordinary process of nature took time to fight off the causes and to return the invalid to normality. Therefore, where there was an instantaneous recovery some power above nature, some supernatural cause brought it about. This divine power Jesus had, for he was himself divine, the Son of God. AFFIRMATION MASS we welcome those First Holy Communion candidates and their families to Mass this weekend to renew their commitment to the journey towards Holy Communion in June.

SAINT CHARLES PARISH COUNCIL met last weekend. It was a full meeting, with very positive ideas for future developments in the parish. We felt the need to try to revive parish social activities. PARISH SAFEGUARDING REPRESENTATIVE/SAFEGUARDING OFFICER

Our mission is to offer spiritual guidance and worship in our churches. We work hard to proclaim the message of God's Gospel to those who enter our Churches, and to those who sick, elderly and housebound. As we progress this mission, we are very mindful of our responsibility to the safeguarding of children, young people and vulnerable adults. To do this properly, we are required to have a Parish Safeguarding Representative in place to ensure that we are all following the safeguarding policies and procedures as set out nationally, and by our Diocese.

We remain grateful to Maria Boar, who for many years oversaw this task, connecting with both parishes. However, for quite some months now we have been without a replacement for Maria Boar, despite best efforts to secure one. The role itself encompasses a wide range of duties and covers both our churches. Some may think that is a weighty responsibility. Somewhat weighty, but vitally necessary. Anyone taking on this role will be given full training before they begin and ongoing support from the Diocesan Safeguarding team. The commitment to this role would be temporary – no more than two years, as we progress towards parish-coalescence. You will be rewarded by knowing that your efforts ensure that everyone is aware of their responsibilities for the safety of those people around them, especially the most vulnerable. Please don't think of it as a challenge but as an opportunity. If you want to know more, please ask Fr Don, and more information will be forthcoming.

TOLLE LEGE It would be good if we had more parishioners willing and able **to proclaim the sacred scriptures** from the lectern from time to time. If you are able to volunteer please let me know. A short time of assessment and guidance will be offered to those who accept this offer.
