PARISH NOTES

THIS SUNDAY we celebrate the seventh Sunday in Ordinary Time. It is the last "in ordinary time" till June 18th. Today's green gives way on Wednesday to sombre purple as we voyage together into the 7-week season of Lent. Furthermore, we are invited this weekend to pray together for **the unemployed** - a pressing need in our days. The **Gospel** lesson we have to learn today hardly needs any emphasizing. We must, if we are truly Christian, forgive those who offend or injure us. We must love one and all, whether they be friends or enemies. G. K. Chesterton says: "We are commanded to love our neighbours and our enemies; they are often the same people." It is easy to get on with most people, but in every neighbourhood and in every village or town there will always be those who are difficult. There will be the dishonest, the gossips, the quarrelsome, the critic of everyone and everything. It is when we have dealings with such people that all our Christian charity is necessary. Most likely we will never be able to change their ways of acting, but charity will enable us to tolerate their faults and will move us to pray for their eternal welfare.

ASH WEDNESDAY is a day of fasting & abstinence - the only other similar day is Good Friday. So why not make it special and know a hunger-pang or two? With Immaculate Conception church still being out of weekday usage, I have added occasions for folk to receive their ashes. Please note with care these timings with care. If any housebound or disabled parishioner would welcome an 'ashes-at-home' visit, please message me.

ABOUT LENT

- 1. Lent is the third liturgical season, after Advent & Christmas.
- 2. As Advent prepares us for the Saviour's Birth, Lent prepares us for his 'rebirth' in the Resurrection;
- 3. Ash Wednesday is preceded by Shrove Tuesday, the day when traditionally Catholics were shriven—i.e. received the Sacrament of Penance. Lent begins with a ritual of 'Ashing', to remind us of our nothingness without Christ;
- 4. During Lent we put aside floral decoration in church, we don't sing the 'Gloria', and 'Alleluia' is verboten!
- 5. Although a season of 40 days in remembrance of Jesus' forty days and nights on the mountain, there are 44 days to Maundy Thursday, when Lent ends and the Sacred Triduum begins;
- 6. Many folk put aside Lenten disciplines on the Solemnities during Lent, noticeably St Joseph, the Annunciation, (and for Irish folk, St Patrick's Day).
- 7. Lent is named after the 'lengthening' days in springtime;
- 8. The dating of Ash Wednesday depends on when Easter falls. Easter is the first Sunday after the full moon following the spring equinox;
- 9. There is another 'season' incorporated into Lent: Passiontide is the two weeks preceding Easter Sunday;

- 10. Traditionally there are four biblical imperatives during Lent : Prayer, Fasting, Almsgiving and Repentance.
- 11. Ash Wednesday marked the beginning of the period for fulfilling 'Easter Duties'. Easter Duties? The duty laid on Catholics to go to Confession and Holy Communion at least once during the 15-week period to Trinity Sunday.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS are journeyed on Friday afternoons at 3pm at St Charles. It you would welcome the chance to lead this devotion, according to your own preferred setting, please ask. I hope you will find chance to join in the footsteps of our Divine Lord journeying cross-laden to Calvary.

WELCOME TO THE CHURCH Phillipa and Thomas Carney, baptised this Saturday at St Charles church. May your sainted patrons watch over you.
