

## PARISH NOTES

THIS SUNDAY we celebrate the first Sunday in Lent. The Gospel describes the Lord's forty days and nights of fasting followed by temptations. It has been chosen as a reading for this first Sunday of Lent for our edification and encouragement. Lent is a period of preparation for the central Christian events of Holy Week and the Triduum. Christ, the Son of God in human nature, died the excruciating death of crucifixion on Good Friday, because of the sins of humanity. By this supreme act of obedience to his heavenly Father he made atonement for all our disobediences and set us free from the slavery of Satan and of sin. Christ had no sin to atone for; it was for our sins that he mortified himself. We all have much to atone for. Lent gives us chance to reflect on and repair our weaknesses.

**BISHOP PATRICK** has sent a Pastoral Letter on the Eucharist, to be read at all Masses this weekend.

THIS SUNDAY We hold in prayer those presenting before the Bishop this Sunday afternoon at the Rite of Election in the Cathedral preparing to join the church at the Easter vigil.

SAINT OF THE WEEK St David (520 - 589) The earliest life of St David dates from five centuries after his death, probably in 589. He became eminent as abbot and bishop at the site now known as St David's, but formerly Mynyw, from which the present diocese of Menevia is named. He is credited with a monastic rule based on the example of the Eastern Fathers, and also with a Penitentiary. He was invited to preside at the synod of Llandewibrefi. Monks trained at his monastery evangelized South Wales and made foundations in Cornwall, Brittany and Ireland. St David is said to have sent a Mass rite to Ireland. At his death his contemporary St Kentigern, founder of St Asaph's in North Wales, witnessed in vision his joyful entrance into the joy of his Lord. His holy relics have been found hidden in the fabric of St David's Cathedral, where they are carefully preserved. He was canonized by Pope Callistus II in 1123.

Friday is also dedicated as a **Day of Special Prayer for the Needy and Hungry** of the world—which coincides with what used to be called Women's World Day of Prayer.

#### LENT LIST: PRAYER

- 1. Try to start and end the day with a perfect Sign of the Cross, the first prayer of Catholic Christians;
- 2. *Try to pray the grace before and after meals devoutly and regularly;*
- 3. Try to pray the 'sign-language' prayers more attentively: Bow your head at the name of Jesus; genuflect or bow as best you can when coming to church; beat your breast with sorrow at the Confiteor; make the pre-Holy Communion mark of respect more deliberate; bow your head in the middle of the creed.
- 4. When stuck fuming in traffic, why not slow down with the Rosary? When you take note of an approaching emergency vehicle, pray for those for whom the siren sounds, or for whom the blue light flashes;
- 5. Try to make the Stations of the Cross whether in church or elsewhere at least weekly;
- 6. *Try to attend a weekday Mass when possible.*
- 7. Why not come to Mass five minutes earlier to allow time to 'arrive' into the divine presence;
- 8. To use devotional booklets to help the Lenten journey, especially by following the daily Mass-readings.

**STATIONS OF THE CROSS** are journeyed on Friday afternoons at 3pm at St Charles. If you would welcome the chance to lead this devotion, according to your own preferred setting, please ask. I hope you will find chance to join in the footsteps of our Divine Lord journeying cross-laden to Calvary.

**MONSIGNOR MOORE** has once again kindly agreed to come and hear Lenten confessions in the oratory on Sats 25th March and 1st April.
