










Exploring Australia

continent	A large landmass or area of land. There are seven continents on Earth (e.g. Australia).
state / territory	A region or area within a country (e.g. Queensland).
landmark	A large object or feature that can be seen from a distance.
human feature	An object or place made by people.
physical feature	An object or place made by nature.
climate	The pattern of weather in a place over a long period of time.
coral reef	An underwater structure made by millions of tiny creatures called coral.
the outback	A huge area of desert in Australia where few people live due to its hot, dry climate.
Aboriginal Australians	The original inhabitants of Australia.

<b>Sydney Opera House</b> One of the most famous concert halls in the world.		<b>Parliament House, Canberra</b> The meeting place of the Australian government.	
<b>Sydney Harbour Bridge</b> An iconic bridge stretching across Sydney harbour.		<b>The Great Barrier Reef</b> The biggest coral reef in the world, stretching 2300km.
